James I

- James Stuart (James VI of Scotland) inherited the English throne from his cousin, Elizabeth I, in 1603
 - Elizabeth I died without producing an heir
 - James VI of Scotland became James I of England

James I

 Wanted to establish a permanent Union of the Crowns under one monarch.

- Came to the throne at the peak of monarchical power.
- Found great difficulty in gaining acceptance as a king.-WHY?




James I vs Elizabeth

- Queen Elizabeth recognized the importance of working with Parliament
- James I did not; believed he should be absolute monarch because of <u>Divine Right</u> (God chooses royal families to rule); James I did not listen to Parliament
- Major problems between Parliament & King over issues of Authority, Money, & Religion

Problems between the King and Parliament

Religion

- Refused to make reforms to "purify" the English church of Catholic practices
- All he agreed to was a new translation of the Bible (the "King James Version")



Problems between the King and Parliament

Authority

- James I believed in divine right and absolutism;
- Parliament felt king should be limited by Parliament

Money

 James I has to ask Parliament for money to finance government and life style

The Gunpowder Plot


Took place in 1605.
